## Jarvis' maiden win proves Mugen power still matters

### British Formula Three

Oliver Jarvis' maiden British F3 victory at Mondello Park on Sunday was also the first for Mugen-Honda since Mercedes joined the championship at the start of the year.

Prior to last weekend Mercedes-powered Double R Racing had

taken every race win, pole and fastest lap, but Jarvis managed all three for Carlin Motorsport in the second race at the Irish venue.

"I'm delighted for the whole team, and for Neil Brown Engineering who look after the Mugen engines," said Jarvis. "It's about time we got this win. Before

the season everyone thought you needed a Mercedes to win, but the Mugen is still a strong package. You also need a good team, and we've proved that Carlin is still a top team."

Jarvis comfortably drove away from the Mercedes-powered cars of James Walker and Mike

Conway, on a circuit that was expected to suit the apparent bottom-end supremacy of the German powerplant.

It was Carlin's first British F3 win since last October, when it capped a dominant season with a double victory at Silverstone for Charlie Kimball.
